On May 25, 2019, volunteers from AZPHC and 2 families met bright and early at the National Memorial Cemetery. They were there to help place flags on the more than 88,979 graves to pay tribute to the deceased veterans for the Memorial Day Ceremony on Monday. After brief instructions we picked an area of the cemetery and got to work.

One of the families that joined us were from Tucson, stationed at David Monthan AFB, and were visiting the other family for the weekend. The other family was from Buckeye stationed at Luke AFB. They usually placed flags in Tucson but since they were in the Phoenix area asked if they could join us.

Even with so many flags to place, the job was done in no time. With everyone working for about an hour and the job was complete. I really enjoyed Tammy's comment "Amazing what you can accomplish when you get a group of people working together." I don't think I have seen that many Boy and Girl Scouts in the same place at one time! There were also several corporations and state agencies represented. It was so breathtaking to look out over the cemetery and see all the flags after it was done.

After the job was done, it was on to Time Square for a nice breakfast. The conversation and food were great. It was a nice end to an impressive event, and it was all over before 10:30 am.

Tuesday after Memorial Day it was the reverse process. A friend and I went to the cemetery to help remove all the flags. Surprisingly the job was done just as quickly. After the flags were removed, the long and lengthy task to sort and bundle them until next year began. We had to leave well before the job was completed, but several bins were filled and ready for storage before we left.


